This is it, Cartography. YOU ARE HERE: THE FINAL PROJECT

A project you propose and complete individually or in a group

A project that explores more deeply an idea / theme / skill / question that emerged from this class

A project that is "real." That means that it's a mural, a website, a book, a collection of photographs, a film (?), or something else with an audience.

A project that advances your thinking around mapping. Meaning: it pushes you to create something difficult.

A project that will take approximately 10 class periods to complete, in addition to ~10 hours outside of class

Examples include:

A digital or physical map that documents your family's history or relationship to places

A very large paper mache project that maps the earth or another 3-dimensional environment

Create a "treasure map," including treasures, and distribute to friends/family/strangers

A "participatory"/collaborative map (digital or physical) that collects geographic information from iSchool students

What's the central question that drives your project? This is difficult. Another way of saying this might be: What are you hoping to discover or learn or investigate through your project? Another way of saying that might be: What's the point of your project?
